I left The Oratory because I had a daughter who was born profoundly deaf, which led me into attending a Diploma Course in Deaf Education at London University and later an M.Sc. at Surrey University.



He was appointed a CBE for services to music in 2012 and was made an independent peer in the House of Lords. Calypso 2022 brought together deaf and hearing musicians, artists, filmmakers, and writers from across the UK, USA and Barbados. Music





Peter was born in Trinidad, educated at The Oratory School, was an outstanding rugby and cricket sportsman (He can be seen in the Oratory Cricket team photo sitting far right) and became a City of London Chartered Accountant. He then worked for Ernst & Young, eventually becoming its Managing Director for the West Indies. He used Barbados as his base from 1969 to 2004. As well as his professional work he became Co-founder, Chairman and Volunteer CEO for the Substance Abuse Foundation, Co-Founder and First Chairman Barbados Entrepreneurship Foundation, Founder, Patron and first chairman of the Barbados charity Aspire Foundation (Barbados), and Patron & Advisor of The Nature Fun Ranch helping the development of at-risk youth.

Peter, as a philanthropist and family man, alongside his wife Jan, has set up the Peter & Jan Boos Family Foundation supporting youth development, entrepreneurship, education, addiction treatment, environmental protection, arts and culture development, relief of poverty and support of various community and charitable causes that focus on integral human development. Specialkidz & Specialkidz International are very honoured to have him as its first Honorary President.

2023 has marked the 63rd year of collaboration between Peter Boos and myself working together to improve the lives of deaf children, young people and adults in Barbados and England.

In 2022, after setbacks with COVID, we managed to implement the Barbados "CALYPSO" project, which without Peter's real involvement and his support of Ruth Montgomery and myself, the project would never have been such a success. The following organisations were involved in the project namely Decibels, Audiovisability, Specialkidz International, Barbados Council for the Disabled and the Peter Boos













is a powerful expressive tool in society, and in our digital age it often attracts and inspires people from all corners of the world. This project drew on the vibrant history of Calypso music on the island of Barbados, blending it with Hip-Hop and digital music, to emphasise the island's culture as well as looking at deafness and the world at large.

The message was loud and clear: deaf people can do anything, except hear perfectly, and deaf Barbadians demand that their voices are heard. He grew up in Highclere Park (home of Downton Abbey) before moving to London to embark on a career as a shipbroker. After becoming a director and board member at E A Gibson, he set up Chartwell Shipping in partnership with a colleague. His work has taken him to a variety of countries and involves continuously trying to understand a wide range of different cultures. Since moving the company to Winchester, James has studied both counselling and teaching English as a foreign language at King Alfred's College, as well as two arts courses at the Open University. His interests centre on arts, sport and his family - a wife and three daughters, one of whom, Anna has

autism and learning disabilities.

South Run in 1998 for Hampshire
Autistic Society, and the Great
North Run again in 2010 for
MS Society.

One of the reasons for James becoming a Trustee of Specialkidz International was related to Anna. She amassed in excess of £5000 for Winchester GO LD by undertaking a special run around her village: see the photos of Anna and James. Specialkidz is delighted to be able to support the work that Winchester GO LD undertakes on behalf of people with learning disabilities including Autism as they are struggling, like all charities in these strange and challenging times.

I cannot speak or write too highly of his outstanding contribution to the success of Specialkidz. He has helped to organise with me a number of very successful seminars focused on autism based at the Centre for Autism at the University of Reading for parents, lecturers, teachers, students and individuals with autism and learning disabilities.

Vint is also Google's Vice President, and he and his wife Sigrid Cerf, who was profoundly deaf before having another cochlear implant, continue to be worldwide ambassadors and supporters of our UK based Medical & Educational Technological Enterprises Consortium. METEC is in the process of still trying to set up the Sigrid & Vint Cerf Research Centre at either Oxford University, the University of Surrey or the University of Reading. Vint has an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Reading and has strong associations with Oxford University. His major lecture there was entitled "The Pacification of Cyberspace."


MICHAEL McALEENAN
